

Program by Michael Yannette

Donald Waxman, a native of Baltimore, studied from an early age at the Peabody Conservatory, where his teachers were Carlotta Heller in piano, Felix Mendelssohn in cello and Elliott Carter in composition. He continued his education at the Juilliard School where he received a BS in composition. Mr. Waxman has enjoyed a distinguished career as a composer, pianist, teacher, lecturer and music editor. Among his many awards are two Klemm Composition Prizes (at Peabody), the RCA Composition Prize, a Guggenheim Fellowship to Paris, the Delius Society National Chamber Music Award and the Gold Medal Award as the first American Composer-in-Residence at the Kang Nung (Korea) Music Festival. Mr. Waxman has composed music for almost every genre, much of it on commission, but is particularly well known to the piano teaching community for his Pageants for Piano Series and the four books of Fifty Etudes.

Marlene Woodward-Cooper joined the faculty of PBAU in 1970, having moved to Florida to pursue a career as a professional musician. She has played the piano in churches and composed music since she was eight years old. She has several teaching pieces for piano published by Belwin, and her newer compositions, especially for four-hands, have been performed extensively. Ms. Woodward's credentials include Juilliard School of Music; B.M., M.M., Manhattan School of Music.



Michael Yannette brings a rich and varied performance background to all of his artistic endeavors. A professional pianist, accompanist, music director and music educator for 25 years, Mr. Yannette holds a bachelor's degree from Florida State University. While at FSU he received nearly every available performance award including the Ernst von Dohnanyi Prize, the Richard E. Burgin Scholarship, the winner of the FSU Concerto Competition and the Florida

Collegiate Artist Competition, and was named the 1986 Presser Scholar. He wrote, produced and starred in the title role of *An Evening with George Gershwin*, a one-man show about the life of the great composer.

As a concert pianist Mr. Yannette has been a performer for over 25 years. He most recently performed for the Scriabin Society of America in a master class held by Jerome Lowenthal of the Juilliard School in New York City.

As an accompanist, Mr. Yannette is sought after in both vocal and instrumental music of all genres. However, he especially enjoys his work with choirs and vocalists. He is an annual accompanist for the Florida All-State Choirs and American Choral Directors Association All-State Choirs and has performed with ACDA National and Southern Division Choirs. Most recently he performed with choirs at both Carnegie Hall and Avery Fischer Hall at Lincoln Center in New York City. Last year he was the accompanist for the OAKE (Orff and Kodaly) National Children´s Choir in Denver, Colorado. Michael is also the co-founder of the Young Singers of the Palm Beaches and directs the Men´s A Capella Choir.

Fantasia on Mysterium, a theatrical performance created by Michael Yannette, features the life and music of Russian composer Alexander Scriabin.


