



October 25, 7 PM at the Clarke Recital Hall, U. of M. Frost School of Music, Coral Gables





training.

Mrs. Brodsky is the founder, director and chief artistic advisor of Patrons of Exceptional Artists, Inc. a foundation dedicated to the support of exceptionally gifted performing artists. She is also the co-founder and artistic director of the Miami International Piano Festival, where she oversees all music events.

Her track record for finding and presenting exceptional artists has been

impressive and she is widely recognized as an authority figure in the field of classical musical. She has been featured in publications such as the New York Times, Piano Today, International Piano Magazine, the Miami Herald, and Steinway Magazine.

Mrs. Brodsky is committed to the promotion of classical music and oversees the educational activities of the Festival. She has pioneered the "Prodigies and Masters of Tomorrow" series as part of the Festival which has resulted in the production of a documentary that was aired on PBS television. This forward-thinking program has reached hundreds of school children through collaborations with the Broward Center for the Performing Arts.




