President's Message

Greetings!

Do you ever feel as if time is speeding up? As we are fast approaching the first day of Spring, I can hardly believe that this season is nearly over. Furthermore, I can hardly believe that I've been teaching for......what??? 30 YEARS?!? That is long enough to have watched more than one set of students grow up, start driving themselves to their piano lessons, graduate, go off to college, get married, and even start having babies! Yes, time flies which is why we must cherish every moment we have with our students. They are our legacy after all.

I've said it before and I'll say it again. BCMTA has blessed me with the greatest group of mentors anyone could ever ask for. One fabulous idea (among many) I've adopted from Sue Colvert is to have an annual Alumni Drop-In Party over the holidays. I decided to set December 29th as a fixed annual date. I send out a reminder notice in November followed by an e-vite in early December. I also copy the e-vite to my private "Miss Sheri's Alumni Association" Facebook page. I invite all former students to drop by anytime between 11AM and 11PM.

This season I was so blessed to receive a total of 10 former students plus Andrew Boss, former student of Mary Beth Purchase. They arrived at all different times throughout the day and night, sometimes overlapping to reunite with other former students. I received calls and emails from many others who could not attend. While some of these students were "lifers"---meaning they started lessons at a young age and stayed through their senior year---others were not with me but a few years, yet that special bond was formed for life.

For example, one of this year's visitors, Ella Roehm, had taken lessons for five years stopping around 9th grade. I had not seen her in over 12 years! We had a wonderful reunion and now at age 25, she wants to come back for lessons over the summer with a renewed passion to learn more.

I am so impressed by how well all of my former students are doing as adults. Several had studied abroad sharing stories of their world travels with me. Many are actively pursuing exciting careers in veterinarian surgery, pharmacology, medicine, environmental science, engineering, industrial psychology, business, politics, law, computer technology, dance, and music.

The colleges attended by my former students include Princeton, Tufts, Belmont, Southern Methodist University, Duke, Vassar, Berklee College of Music, University of Miami, Tulane, Florida Atlantic University, California Institute of Technology, Central FL University, Nova Southeastern University, and the University of Florida. Some are already pursuing Master's degrees and even Doctorate degrees.

REMINDERS

- Participating teachers, send any student additions and/ or withdrawals to Peggy Gallagher at peggygallagher9@gmail.com no later than Monday, March 10th. Make sure you list the student's name and level. If adding a student, also mail a check for \$20 for Primary Level or \$25 for Levels 1-12 payable to FSMTA District VI to Mary Beth Purchase at 720 NW 12th AVE, Pompano Bch, FL 33060. If there are no changes, there is no need to respond.
- Remember to send a rating sheet with each Student for the correct level with the repertoire filled in and your teacher # written in the upper right hand corner. Measures must be numbered. No photocopies allowed.
- Make sure the performance level is within one level higher or lower than the student's theory level. Make sure that beginning with level 5 the 3 memorized selections are from 3 different historical periods.
- No arrangements, unless by the composer, and no "popular" music are allowed. However, Festival music is allowed, and regardless of the style, can be considered 20/21 century music.

This year's Musicthon was held Jan. 17-19 at the Galleria Mall. Over 300 students, representing 23 studios participated in the event this year. These participating students raised over \$9,400. Along with the extraordinary donation of \$5,000, given by a generous patron of the arts, Mr. Richard Ingham, and cash donations received at the Mall, the total amount provided by Musicthon tallied \$14,581. Funds raised during Musicthon are used to support BCMTA's educational and enrichment programs, such as student Summer Camp, as well as student competitions. 


