

An Interview with Susanna La Joie

When I heard that Susanna LaJoie was retiring from piano teaching and offering her extensive music library for sale even as she just celebrated her 80th birthday, I thought it appropriate to celebrate her career. After all, independent music teachers do not receive "gold watches" or "company severance packages" upon retirement. However, we can certainly be honored by our fellow colleagues. As Susanna closes one door and opens another in her life focusing on her wonderful family which includes several grandchildren and a great-grandchild, we will honor her lifelong commitment to music education.

Susanna was born in Durham, North Carolina in 1933. Her mother was a piano teacher and her father was a clergyman. Both parents encouraged her to play the piano beginning at the age of 3 1/2. Susanna continued to study with her Mom until she reached school age. After high school, Susanna went on to major in music at the University of NC at Greensboro receiving her Bachelor's degree in piano performance. She feels her most useful experience in college was her extremely demanding piano pedagogy class taught by Mrs. Atkisson who had also taught Susanna's mother. This teacher required that students go through hundreds of teaching pieces and books to evaluate the specific goals that could be reached by the study of each piece. Practice teaching was also required with many one-on-one experiences.


After graduation from college, Susanna taught privately in Greensboro and did advanced work studying the organ. In 1955, Susanna met and married Leo LaJoie who was an accountant by profession but also played clarinet and saxophone as a professional jazz musician. Susanna and Leo moved to Florida in 1955 to make South Florida their home. Susanna began her South Florida career by teaching kindergarten music. After her two daughters, Lisa and Debra, and a son, Richard, were in school, she opened her home piano studio. Susanna joined BCMTA near the beginning of its establishment in 1968 and served as President for two years. She is also a long standing member in the National Federation of Music Clubs, the National Guild of Piano Teachers, and the American Guild of Organists. Susanna has enjoyed serving as an certified adjudicator for local and state Federation Junior Festivals.

What is your philosophy for teaching?

I feel that my purpose was to instill a lifelong of music in each student by their exposure to music of the great masters.

Did you continue to perform during your years of teaching?

Yes. I enjoyed performing Piano duet music with Dianne Garvin, Sue Colvert, and most recently Bob Beals. Bob and I incorporated video scenes along with our performances of such great works as "Carnival of the Animals" Pictures of War by Alfredo Caselia. Other performances included works by Saint-Saens, the Sonata by Poulenc, the Brahms "Hungarian Dances" culminating in the recording of two CDs in collaboration with Robert Beals.

You played the organ along with the piano? Yes, I have enjoyed playing the organ in several churches throughout the years ending my organ career in the Trinity Methodist church in Lighthouse Pointe.

Where have you taught?

In addition to my home studios in Plantation and Sunrise, I taught at Broward Community College as an adjunct piano teacher for 29 years.

Did you teach specific age groups?

I've taught all ages from age 6 through adulthood and some of my most enjoyable students have been adult students. The adults I've worked wanted to learn and it gave me great pleasure to see them progress.

What advice would you give to young teachers? Don't allow people to take advantage of your time by treating you as the "baby-sitter." Establish your boundaries from the beginning and have a written policy that is adhered to.

Susanna feels very blessed to have enjoyed her fulfilling career for 55 years and will cherish the memories of her students always.




